

**REGULAR MEETING OF LAUREL RUN BOROUGH COUNCIL – JULY 16, 2019 - 7:00 P.M.**

The meeting was called to order by the President, with The Pledge to The Flag, followed by a moment of silence. Roll was taken.

**CITIZEN'S TO BE HEARD:** Rich Yurkin, on behalf of the Hill Climb Association thanked Council, The Mayor and The Fire Department for all they did to make the Hill Climb a success.

Brian Heck of Dupont Drive asked for an update on paving Dupont Drive. Shandra told him The Borough is applying for the multi-modal grant and if not successful in attaining it, funding from the Community Block Grant coming up in 2020 will be sought. She will check with Mr. Hurst as to whether new surveys need to be conducted of residents on Dupont Drive, if so, they will be mailed.
